Florida Rural Water Partnership

The Midway Community has received the Exploratory Engineering Report and Order of Magnitude Opinion of Capital Costs. We will be reviewing the report with Rural Water Staff in a few weeks. We have also been notified in regards to grants that MCCWA is eligible for on or around 75% of the allowable grants. We will be meeting with the grant staff in the upcoming weeks. We still have a long way to go to determine if having a well is possible. However, we are well on our way.

Elderly Scholarships

Be On The Lookout

If you see a water truck or individuals dispensing water out of any of the fire hydrants located in Midway, please call the after hours numbers to inform us of the issue. Please have information available such as the location of the hydrant and if possible, the license plate or description of the vehicle. Water that is stolen from the fire hydrants costs the residents of Midway as we still have to pay the City of Sanford for the water that is being stolen. Recycling Pick up is every Tuesday. We are on the lookout for the street with the most recycle bins out on the 1st Tuesday of every month!

Water Definitions

Aquifer- (unconfined) --an aquifer whose upper water surface is at atmospheric pressure, and thus is able to rise and fall.

Water Artesian Groundwater that is under pressure when tapped by a well and is able to rise above the level at which it is first encountered. It may or may not flow out at ground level. The pressure in such an aquifer commonly is called artesian pressure, and the formation containing artesian water is an artesian aquifer or confined aquifer.
